INTRODUCTION

NELUMBO, NEPAL is a non-profit making, non-governmental organization established in 2017 A.D., located in Pokhara, Gandaki Province, Nepal.

NELUMBO, NEPAL since its establishment is devoted in serving the people in need with its program related to health, quality education, environment and awareness. Till date NELUMBO, NEPAL has conducted different health camps (general and dental), education related programs, environmental program and awareness programs on various topics. Along with these programs, it has also been providing support to those who cannot afford minor treatment, surgery or medication for their illness. It aims to generate impacts on the lives of poor and marginalized population through proper and quality programs and services which it has been conducting since the initial phase.

Our Vision

Proper health care and quality education services accessible, affordable and acceptable to all in Nepal.

Our Mission

To improve the life condition of poor and marginalized people in the remote areas of Nepal through basic health and education services.

- To work in co-ordination with the local government bodies, institutions and community for the effectiveness of the program.

Geographical Coverage



This year we have expended our regular programs related to health and education in ward no. 8 Dangsing and ward no 9 Tikhedhunga of Annapurna Rural Municipality and ward no. 7 Dhampus of Machhapucchhre Rural Municipality. But with the outbreak of COVID-19 NELUMBO, NEPAL broadened its area of coverage to other wards of the aforementioned Rural Municipalities along with Madi Rural Municipality.

PROJECTS

In 2020, NELUMBO, NEPAL had four major projects running namely,

A. Health and Education Aid in Nepal

1. Health Camps

Free health camp is organization's regular activity which with time has become one of the prominent program of the organization. This program has served hundreds of people of its working area; with a mission to create healthy and prosperous community. Embracing the same

goal, NELUMBO, NEPAL had planned a three-day long free health camp and free medicine distribution along with awareness program which was supposed to be held on March 13, 14 and 15 of 2020.

All the preparations were completed two days prior to the camp and some of the logistics required for camp were taken to the camp site on March 11, 2020. It was then, when Nepal Government had issued a notice which read, 'Request to hold all the mass gatherings till the next notice' as one of the government's move in trying to curb the spread of **COVID-19** virus, as World Health Organization (WHO) has kept Nepal at **high risk area** from COVID-19.

2. Education Program

i. Materials Support to Schools

Menstrual Hygiene is one of the neglected problems in our community which impacts the concept and practice of gender equality in every institution of the society, either directly or indirectly. The school can be the ideal setting for providing information and change opportunities regarding the Menstrual Hygiene. Many female students at school face problems like fear, confusion, teasing, lack of proper advice and support regarding it. Similarly, there remains the negative socio-cultural restrictions and other reasons like; shortage of soap and water, sanitary products, sanitation and waste disposal facilities in the school environment resulting in absenteeism of the girl students. These leads in impacting girls' learning and education opportunities diminishing the gender equality and empowerment. Understanding this scenario and the immense need of this problem to be addressed, NELUMBO, NEPAL on February 17, 2020 and March 04, 2020 provided, government schools of Machhapuchhre Rural Municipality-06, Dhital (Shree Baraha Secondary School & Shree Bhumeshwor Secondary School) and government schools of Machhapuchhre Rural Municipality-07, Dhampus (Shree Prithivi Narayan Secondary School and Shree Udaya Secondary School) respectively, with sanitary pads as per the assessed need.

ii. Euro-guard Distribution

In order to achieve sanitation and water beyond household to include other institutional setting

such as schools, health care facilities, workplace and other public places for all by 2030 efforts has been made globally. NELUMBO, NEPAL has also started to work from its level to achieve Sustainable Development Goal 6: Clean Water and Sanitation with distribution of Euro-guards to public schools along with awareness program about the importance of water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH). It is the continuity of last year's program by covering other remaining schools and as per the assessed need.



iii. Training for Primary level teachers

3 days Integrated Curriculum Training for Basic Level (1-3 class) was jointly organized by NELUMBO, NEPAL and Machhapuchhre Rural Municipality-06, Dhital from August 7 to August 9, 2020. The training sessions were facilitated by Education Department of Machhapuchhre Rural Municipality. Primary level teachers from all government schools of Dhital were present in the program. The main objective of the training program was to familiarize teachers with the new curriculum, its structure and objectives, work book, effective teaching and learning techniques, assessment and evaluation process, etc.

As the training was conducted during the time of pandemic, all the precaution measures like provision of masks and sanitizer to the participants, disinfection of training hall and other materials after each day was done throughout the training period to prevent the spread of the disease.

3. Environmental Program

Human's existence entirely depends upon the well-being of environmental factors like air, water, soil, etc. But in recent years many environment related problems like air pollution, water pollution, rise in sea level, bio-diversity degradation, etc. has increased causing serious issues related to health and well-being of people all around the world.

It is everybody's responsibility to keep their surrounding clean and promote the prosperity of the environment for which even small activity like cleanliness of surrounding around us plays a significant role in general health and well-being of people. With that in mind NELUMBO, NEPAL started its environment related program this year with the distribution of dustbins in Dhampus, Machhapuchhre Rural Municipality which is a popular tourist area for both domestic and international tourists. Those dustbins were handed over to the local youth club called *Srijana Cultural Family*. Distributed dustbins were installed in public area with maximum coverage to the places with maximum flow of people. Similarly, dustbins were also handed over to Annapurna Rural Municipality-03, Marauche and Manab Sewa Ashram of Pokhara.

Loss of forest area is one of major concern nowadays all over the world the impact of which like climate change, soil erosion, loss of biodiversity, increase in pollution level, etc. can be experienced. So, along with the dustbin distribution saplings were provided to the local community people of Dhampus and some were planted by NELUMBO, NEPAL staffs in coordination with the aforementioned youth club on the bare land and forest area of Dhampus. The main objective of this program was promotion of clean and green environment.

4. Medical Charity Fund

i. Parbati and Dipendra Nepali

Parbati Nepali & Dipendra Nepali, a mother-son family were suffering from illness for several years. With no one to support, they have not been able to get necessary treatment and medication. After knowing their situation and doing assessment, NELUMBO, NEPAL supported them with foods and health treatment. Parbati was diagnosed with *Bipolar Affective Disorder (BPAD)* and *Depression*. Dipendra was diagnosed with *Dissociative Disorder, Catatonia* and also showed the signs of *Autism* during treatment. Parbati Nepali's health condition has improved after regular medication and now is able to work and look after her son. Dipendra's condition has also improved considerably after treatment, medication and physical therapy. He has also obtained citizenship from Phedikhola-04, Syangja with the support from Machhapuchhre Rural Municipality-06.

NELUMBO, NEPAL is monitoring their monthly check-ups and also supporting them to reestablish in community to lead normal lives.

ii. Santa Bahadur Dhakal

Santa Bahadur Dhakal from Pokhara Metropolitan City-18, Sarangkot, Padheli has been patient of mental illness for a long period of time. With no family member to support for his treatment, it was difficult for him to get the required treatment. NELUMBO, NEPAL has been supporting him in his regular treatment and medication from 2019. He has regular check-up every month and gets the prescribed medication accordingly with the support from NELUMBO, NEPAL.



B. Quality Education in Nepal

NELUMBO, NEPAL, supports teachers and parents in educating children and to promote the sociability of the child. As parents, teachers and school play vital role in the child's development, NELUMBO, NEPAL has planned to work with them by intervening in the early stage which is more economic as well as long lasting approach compared to repairing the problem that is developed as a result of delayed or damaged development. Various activities were planned to support the need at John Jyoti School from February 04, 2020. NELUMBO, NEPAL has provided the much-needed human resources for effective execution of day-to-day activities at the school. With this support, the administrative work has been more organized than before and the school now has much more maintained and child friendly garden. The school has also updated their study materials which are necessary for teaching and learning in every class. These activities were performed in the first month of program execution.

With the outbreak of COVID-19 in April 2020, all the new academic sessions were postponed which hampered the goal and objectives of the project. All the pre-planned activities for the new session's activities came to a halt without being able to implement the program. At the end of the year as the lockdown was lifted activities like homework for students, maintenance of school and other administration work was carried out.

C. Preparedness and Response Activities related to COVID-19

NELUMBO, NEPAL is solely focusing on the prevention of the disease for which it has been working in coordination with Government of Nepal to support the country's preparedness and response activities and also to address the direct and indirect effects of pandemic on most vulnerable population. NELUMBO, NEPAL had planned comprehensive programs to effectively prevent and manage this outbreak. The response program especially focused on three aspects i.e., awareness, medical safety materials distribution and relief distribution.

The main objectives of this program are mentioned below:

- i. To scale up the preventive measures to contain the outspread of disease
- ii. Supporting Medical Safety Materials to health facilities and other frontline workers
- iii. Distributing Food Relief Materials to the needy and vulnerable population
- iv. Collaborating and coordinating with local government, organization, clubs and volunteers for the effective implementation of the program.

Beneficiaries

NELUMBO, NEPAL has been mainly focusing on supporting/aiding the people who are working in frontline (health care givers, police personnel, reporters, etc.) to fight against the pandemic and other vulnerable populations (daily wage laborers, elderly people and children) who are directly or indirectly affected. They were mainly supported with medical safety materials and food relief items. We have been able to reach more than **175,263** individuals till date (One hundred seventy five thousand two hundred and sixty three) individuals till date.

1. Distribution of Medical Safety Materials

Even the countries with highest level of health care system is having a hard time to cope with the sudden increase in number of patients, so for a country like ours it is easy to interpret how difficult it had become to manage the cases for health facilities as hundreds of new cases are registered on daily basis. With COVID-19 being highly contagious, proper use of personal protective equipment along with other medical safety materials is vital during the pandemic. In order to address the outbreak, NELUMBO, NEPAL supported the local governments, health care centers and other organizations in its working area with much needed medical safety items like Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), infrared thermal gun, KN95 masks, N95 masks (3M), surgical masks, disposable gloves, sanitizers, hand-washing soap, apron, etc. to strengthen the health system and to prevent the further transmission of the disease. The primary focus of this program were the frontline workers like health personnel, police officers, journalists, social volunteers, etc. who are providing continuous service to the general population from the frontline and are at high risk of getting infected.

Along with that, NELUMBO, NEPAL installed a contactless foot operated hand-washing station at Pokhara-4, Gairapatan, Gyanmarga Theatre Area with regular supply of water and soap; where there is constant flow of people. Pictures on hand-washing technique is displayed on the tank for the mass awareness about proper and effective hand-washing technique.

2. Relief Distribution Program

Sudden enforcement of lockdown, has pushed many organization, business and individuals at their limit. On one hand, lockdown has helped to contain the further spread of disease to some extent throughout the country while on the other hand, it has affected the economy of the whole country; the workers who depends on daily wages for their living seemed to be most affected by lockdown. Many were temporarily unemployed with no other source of income and savings to support their families during the period of lockdown. In order to address this problem, NELUMBO, NEPAL coordinated and collaborated with various local governments, organizations and local social clubs to support the affected population.


In collaboration with Bhintuna Youth Club (Local club) from Pokhara-03, Tersapatti, NELUMBO NEPAL distributed meals to individuals residing in Pokhara-03 for 3 days. These individuals predominantly included daily wage laborers and also small business holders/street vendors

who were having difficulty to survive this crisis. Also, a marginalized family from Machhapuchhre Rural Municipality and Pokhara-09, Damkalmarga was supported from this program.

Similarly, in coordination with local governments of the respective wards of Pokhara-04 (Gairapatan), Pokhara-15 (Kolpatan) and Pokhara-28 (Kalikasthan and Majhthana), NELUMBO, NEPAL supported many poor and disadvantaged families with food packages which included rice, lentils (Daal), soyabean, cooking oil, beaten/flattened rice and salt and also other hygiene products like hand washing soap, tooth brush and tooth paste.

Likewise, various shelter homes situated inside the Pokhara Valley were provided with food, clothing items, and essential medicines amidst the pandemic. Also, the prisoners of District Jail Administration, Kaski were supported with dignity kit whereas their small children who are residing with them were provided with warm clothes as winter season was fast approaching. 3. Awareness Program

The awareness programs related to general etiology of COVID-19 was conducted at various place and institutions in different forms to aware people about this newly found virus which has been effecting almost all countries around the world. First awareness program on COVID-19 was conducted at Machhapuchhre Rural Municipality-06, Dhital on February 14, 2020 which was later followed by many other sessions in schools, door to door awareness materials distribution, etc. The program was focused mainly for local community representatives, ground level health workers (Female Community Health Volunteers), students, teachers and also general population. The main objective for conducting this program was to aware people

about the newly discovered virus and the preventive measures to stay safe during this global pandemic.

In response to the rapid increase in cases, NELUMBO, NEPAL in collaboration Annapurna Rural Municipality conducted door to door awareness program in which each and every household in the aforementioned municipality were distributed flyer (containing awareness materials related to COVID-19, Nutrition and Waste management), hand-washing soap and disposable masks. Similar program was conducted in coordination with local government of Pokhara Metropolitan City ward no. 02 and Lions Club of Pokhara Central Garden in Pokhara Metropolitan City.

One of the most significant public health measures implemented during the outbreak to halt the further spread of virus was lockdown which extended time and again with the increase in cases where everyone was locked inside the house with schools, offices, factories and other outdoor activities closed. With monotonous routine and the feeling of being trapped inside a house for weeks can surely affect one's mental well-being be that be an adult or a child. But children and adolescents are having hard time to adjust to the setting as they are used to go to schools and do other outdoor activities. With way too much free time at hand and having to stay inside house 24/7 has proven to be hard situation to cope with for children.

With this situation at hand, NELUMBO, NEPAL sponsored a counseling program in Fewa Television called 'Kura Maan Maan Ka'. Parents and children were the main target audience of this program which especially focused on the ways to cope with the emotional turmoil, mental health and many other contemporary issues regarding the matter invited by the pandemic. 4. Miscellaneous: General Health Camp

One day free health camp was conducted at the premises of District Police Office, Kaski on October 10, 2020. This camp was conducted upon the request of Police Superintendent in concern with the health of police personnel working in this pandemic. The services like general check-up, medicines distribution and laboratory services were provided free of cost to all the police personnel as per the requirement. The main objective for organizing this health camp was to provide regular health check-ups to these frontline workers who are providing continuous service even in this unprecedented time.

Going for regular check-up during this time is near to impossible and also not a wise decision as the hospitals and health care centers have become a battle field during this pandemic. So, in order to provide regular health check-up to police personnel who are working in the frontline and contributing to fight this pandemic and also to provide the regular essential services; this health camp was organized.

A total of 130 police personnel registered for check-up in the camp. Among the total registered, 65 had normal health conditions, 35 had lab check-up for different problem and other 47 were prescribed with different medicines as per their need which was provided on them on the next day.

D. Mobile Dental Care

Mouth is window to overall health of our body and touches every aspect of our lives but is yet taken for granted. Oral health is of great importance at any age be it 80 or 8. In the context of Nepal, oral diseases like dental caries, gingivitis, and periodontitis are the most common problems due to lack of oral health awareness, accessibility to service and weak financial condition. The concept of Mobile Dental Clinic can be very effective in Nepal as major health services are centralized which limits the accessibility of the oral health service among the rural population which out numbers the urban population.

Mobile dentistry is the practice of providing services on-field, in a moving vehicle which consists of basic dental services, including x-ray equipment, sterilization facilities, and other dental related equipment. Mobile dental services typically include routine care such as initial exams, dental x-rays, cleanings, fillings, disease screening, etc.

In 2020, purchasing Mobile Dental Van was one of the initial steps in introducing this full flagged project. The van was handed over to Suvhakamana Electricals for interior and exterior remodeling

that would be preferred as Mobile Dental Van. During the process, the van was equipped with the necessary dental equipment. The remodeling process was supposed to be start from early April but was disturbed by global pandemic followed by lockdown. The remodeling of the van; interior dental setup along with outer decoration and staff recruitment will be completed by January 2021 and the project will be in operation from February 2021.

Main objective of this program:

- Organizing medical camps to identify health problems related to dental and to create awareness among general people,
- Supporting the marginalized and poor population with their treatment related to oral who cannot afford treatment for themselves.
- Awareness program about effects of smoking and drinking on general health and wellbeing,
- Dental check-up service by specialized and qualified doctors.

Target Population

Poor and marginalized people residing in rural and remote parts of Nepal; who are deprived of the dental and oral health service because of various reasons.
